Borehamwood Foodbank

The Borehamwood Foodbank provides three days of emergency 'store cupboard' food for those who are in crisis.

Food is issued on receipt of a voucher and can be obtained through case workers from a number of local organisations such as Affinity Sutton, The Job Centre and the Citizens Advice Bureau or the Children's Centre.

The Foodbank has only been open for a few weeks and we are pleased to be able to help local people. We have also seen a huge generosity from local people, faith groups, businesses and organisations who have given money and food to enable us to get the project underway.

People are having to make difficult decisions and many have to choose between 'heat or eat'. Parents especially limit their food in order to feed their children. One lady burst into tears when she saw the food pack as she and her daughter had not eaten for several days. Another said that she came in embarrassed and fearful but she went out encouraged and with renewed hope not only from the food given but from a cup of coffee, a listening ear and chance to chat.

The Foodbank is run by the Borehamwood and Elstree Christian Council (all the local Churches) and has supporters and volunteers. It is based in St Teresa's Church Hall just behind the Civic Centre and is open on a Monday from 1pm - 3.30pm and on a Thursday from 10am – 12.30pm.

We are always short of tinned or instant potato, tinned sponge puddings, pasta sauces and tinned tomatoes. If you would like to donate food we are very pleased to accept tinned and packet goods, within date, during our opening hours.

At Saffron Green we love maths!

On 15 February 2013 the children spent the morning participating in a whole school maths quiz organised in House teams and with questions for all year groups.

The children's use of mathematical vocabulary was amazing and all involved thoroughly enjoyed it – Our congratulations went to Yellow House who were the overall winners.

The children, however, were proudly showing off their maths' ability and explaining how to set about solving the conundrums. We would like to thank all our parents for such a fantastic turn out.

Annual Report **2012/2013**



Mayor's Summary

Summing up at the Council meeting on 21 March 2013, the Town Mayor Cllr Charles Kelly said "Thanks go to all Councillors and Staff. It has been a terrific year for me and for the Town. We want to build on our successes now and make sure that the services and events we provide are of the very highest standard for our residents. Here's to a superb 2013/14 Council Year!"

Community Services

Allotments (Allum Road and Melrose Avenue Sites): Plot occupancy varies throughout the year but is currently at 100% with all of the 143 plots being used by or allocated to residents to cultivate fruit and vegetables.

Planning and Consultations: the Council considered a total of 246 Planning Applications in its capacity as a Statutory Consultee. It has made a formal written comment on 39 of these. Consultation Responses were made to the Hertsmere Borough Council Revised Core Strategy and the Elstree Way Corridor Action Plan.

Site and Street maintenance: The Council continues to care for the two closed churchyards and church clocks in the town area (All Saints and St Nicholas) and to maintain the two war memorials. The Council is responsible for 53 public benches in Borehamwood.

Grants: This year, the Council was proud to be able to assist with a range of grant awards which were of direct benefit to the local community. The total sum granted was £28,000.

Transport Forum: The Forum continues to make representations on the traffic safety issues at the Stirling Corner Roundabout on the A1. It has also made comments on the White Paper: Green Light for Better Buses, Streetscape Manual (adopted in July) and Bus Route Changes.

Leisure and Entertainment

Hall Bookings: Fairway Hall continues to be a popular choice for a wide range of local groups and is open seven days a week attracting hirers for private functions from within the town and surrounding areas.

Coach Trips: The annual subsidised Coach trips for the over 60's were sold out, showing they are as popular as ever.

Jubilee Beacon Celebrations: The Queen's Jubilee was celebrated first at Allum Hall with a Military inspired Tattoo concert and subsequently at Woodcock Hill with a spectacular event culminating in the lighting of a beacon.

Civic Festival: The fortnight long Festival provided opportunities to attend an array of events and activities. Each year the Council reviews the programme to ensure that standards and variety are maintained. In particular, Families Day was trialled as a weekend event and was well attended on both days.

Fireworks Display: The Annual Fireworks Display saw a crowd of thousands enjoy one of the biggest and best displays of recent years.

Christmas "Switch on" Event: This event continues to grow with the Carol Service in the church being enjoyed by hundreds of residents

and an even bigger ice rink. Since the 1970s the Town Council has provided one of the best Christmas street decoration displays in Hertfordshire and North London.

Children and Young People

School Swimming: The Council has approved the continued School Swimming programme which provides availability of travel by local schools to The Venue pool for lessons.

Youth Council: Any young person can join the Youth Council to engage with issues and concerns and to give a youth perspective on various issues. The Youth Council takes pride in its civic responsibilities such as through maintaining the shrubs at Borehamwood Railway Station or the successful Mitzvah Day Tree Planting at Allum Lane Allotments.

Public Access to Report

The report was approved by Full Council on 21 March 2013 and are available for inspection by any elector in the Parish area by contacting the Town Council Offices or viewing on the Council website. Copies are also available at Hertsmere Borough Council and the Borehamwood Library.
