Stirling Corner Roundabout: Turning on the Lights

At a meeting of the Town Council's Transport and Road Safety Forum in July, representatives of Transport for London were notified once more about the strong views of local residents concerning the safety issues at Stirling Corner roundabout.



The Forum believed that operating the traffic lights on a 24/7 trial basis had made a huge improvement. However, initial reports on the trial had also suggested that an increase in complaints had been received on Southbound traffic queuing on the A1 (especially between 7.00 am – 8.30 am on Monday – Friday).

In addition, the issue of an appropriate pedestrian/cyclist crossing needed to be addressed.

The trial period for permanent lights is scheduled to be assessed in October/November by Transport for London and the Forum will be listening very carefully to the views of road users and interested parties when next discussing the topic at one of its meetings. These meetings are open to the Public. If you would like to join in the debate about this or any other local transport issue, why not come along to one of these? The next one is at the Borough Council Offices at 7.00 pm on Thursday 31 October 2013.

Extended hours at Out of Hours GP Service, Elstree Clinic, Borehamwood from October 2013

Borehamwood GPs have been working with Herts Urgent Care to extend the Out Of Hours Service in the Borehamwood area, and from October 2013 will be extending the operating hours on Saturday and Sunday at Elstree Way Clinic.

For local residents this will result in a more accessible health service outside of practice opening times.

China Town Twinning Update

Since the last edition of the Town Crier, representatives of the Twin Town Association, Town Councillors and interested parties have met to discuss the way forward to bring into effect the possibility of twinning with Wanshan Zhuhai in China.

In July, a letter of intent was sent to China, providing background information about the history and current makeup of Elstree and Borehamwood, including the official guide and map and a number of copies of previous editions of the Town Crier. The letter emphasised the important cultural and economic links that could be established between our respective communities by forging a relationship in a similar way to that enjoyed with Fontenay-aux-Roses in France and Offenburg in Germany.



The next step, if the project is to go ahead, would be to develop a charter between the two Towns. The Town Council welcomes any feedback from residents about this project and any other ideas about town twinning generally. The new link will be celebrated at an International Evening in Fairway Hall on Wednesday 18th September. Tickets are priced at £10 and are available from BETTA.



1 Million Pounds



Ten year Plan for the Aycliffe/Leeming Community

After 18 months of planning, consultation and evaluation the Aycliffe/Leeming Road community have been awarded 1 million pounds by the Big Lottery.

This money is to be used over the next 10 years to help create a community that is cohesive, healthier and fitter, aware, united, proud, inspirational, safe and working with a common purpose. Six key Issues were identified; Youth, Family Activities, Health and Fitness, Further Education, Over 55's and Minority Groups. The first two years of the ten year plan will be focusing on these six areas.

Community Action Hertsmere has been commissioned by The Big Local Partnership to oversee this project. Heather Walsh, the Chief Executive of CAH, and her team have helped the partnership put the plan together. CAH enables and empowers people to become more actively involved and valued, providing support and guidance as well as developing and promoting opportunities for volunteering. Donna Inwood is Chair of the partnership and along with other volunteers has given an enormous amount of time setting up this project. Now along with CAH they have appointed Jennifer Reefe to be the Community Development Worker for the first two years. Jennifer will be working alongside the partnership and CAH as well as organising a series of events to encourage and help spread the word.


When you meet with the residents in your ward and you can do what they have asked of you, it is very rewarding indeed, and one makes a great number of friends over the years.





Increasing the social life of the visually impaired

The Visually Impaired Club meets weekly, on Friday afternoons, at the Maxwell Park Community Centre in Borehamwood between 1:30pm and 4pm.

The club provides a range of activities for blind and partially sighted people from age 25 upwards, from those with some sight such as those with macular degeneration to those with no sight at all.



There are passive activities such as card games using either large or Braille cards, musical activities, book readings and discussion, and active games such as indoor bowls, darts, table tennis etc.

Club organisers are appealing for those with good sight to

tell those with poor sight about the club and, importantly, consider whether they could spare a few hours on Friday afternoons to facilitate the activities. Best of all would be for a sighted person to take a visually impaired person on their first visit to the club.

Community Centre Opening Soon

The Town Council has provided the largest single grant ever in its history as a Local Authority to help towards the costs of building the new Community Centre at 96 Shenley Road.

By contributing £50,000 in capital costs, the Council has affirmed its commitment as a full partner in supporting the new building that will be a great asset to the Town, especially in providing Youth, Museum and Library services.

Every edition of the Town Crier was included in the time capsule planted on site and Town Mayor, Cllr C Butchins said at this event: "The Town Council fully expects the new centre will be a valuable focus for all residents and visitors in the centre of the town, making it an even more vibrant and interesting place in which to live."

The new facilities are scheduled to open at the end of October this year. This is the same time as the High Street Planters on Shenley Road are to

be rejuvenated with shrub planting in a scheme funded jointly by the Town and Borough Councils. It is hoped that the new look planters will provide a neater and more attractive all year round aspect to Shenley Road.

Entertainments Forum


The Entertainments Forum allows members of the community to offer suggestions and ideas about what goes on during the Civic Festival, as well as throughout the year with other community events.


