Celebrating a Century of Film-Making and Television Production

Earlier this year the Spring Edition of Town Crier announced that 2014 is a very special year for Elstree & Borehamwood, the anniversary of 100 years of filmmaking in the local film studios. Half way through 2014 much has been done to celebrate this anniversary.

Through the generosity of the Town Council as well as other government bodies and local groups we've distributed extra copies of the Centenary Souvenir Edition of Town Crier.

Centenary street banners are now flying on lighting columns from the station up to Elstree Studios.

With help from the Youth Council, Central Place has now had a complete makeover!

On 21st June a packed Ark Theatre enjoyed "Music From The Movies" as the BBC Elstree Concert Band pulled out all the stops for a Centenary Concert.

Earlier that week the Centenary Exhibition, running until 13th September opened at the Museum. The exhibition

traces 100 years of history, including interactive displays and some very special items lent by local film and TV veterans.

But there's still more to come over the next few months!

A free guide to the Film & TV Heritage Trail was published earlier in the year. In the Autumn two new panels will be unveiled at the BBC Elstree Centre, commemorating Neptune Studios, where it all started 100 years ago, telling how the

site has been home since to a host of studios, including ATV and now the BBC.



And on Saturday 4th October, for the first time anywhere there will be public screenings of the Centenary Documentary **From Borehamwood To Hollywood**. Introduced onscreen by Barbara Windsor, the documentary will feature highlights from interviews with Steven Spielberg, Sir Roger

Moore, Brian Blessed and Simon Pegg as well as over 40 veterans of the local film and TV studios.




New Opportunity to have an Allotment Plot!

With the help from allocated ring fenced funding from the Borough Council we are delighted to announce that from Easter 2015 a new site of up to 60 individual plots will be opened in North Borehamwood 'Stapleton Gardens'. It is situated on the corner of Stapleton Road and Green Street. The three acre site will have secure access, parking and a water supply.

members, nearly every person said their love of allotment gardening comes from the fresh air, home grown produce, healthy lifestyle and interaction with like-minded people that this activity offers.

In developing this new site the Town Council has listened to the needs of the Community and recognised the demand for more allotments in Borehamwood, especially in the northern part of Town. This expansion will increase the Town Council's provision of an allotment service by a third. Allotment sites are managed by the Council's administrative and grounds teams, but are also kept in good shape by the plot holders themselves. The two allotment champions Tony Cox (Allum Lane) and Anne Nicodemus (Melrose Avenue) have worked extremely hard in keeping a community spirit alive at the sites, dealing with practical concerns of plot holders and helping to run an annual competition (with prizes and trophies awarded by the Town Council). The intention is to build on these successes at Stapleton Gardens. You might be the Stapleton Gardens Champion we need!

Existing plot holders will also notice improvements to the sites over the coming months as the Town Council continues to improve the tracks, parking facilities and water supply.



Hillside School Revisited

1939

The County Council Senior School was due to open in September but war was declared. With air raid shelters improved, 'Hillside' opened in November.

Headmaster Mr Gernat's pupils were primary age, not seniors. An Austrian boy refugee used his host's Leica camera to photograph the school, questioned by Special Branch officers, he was 'let off' as teacher Mr O'Keefe developed the pictures. The R.A.F used the confiscated camera, it was returned later!

1940s

Evacuee Peter Johnson's soldier father, killed in 1943, is remembered on Elstree War Memorial. The Museum published Peter's book on his wartime boyhood.

1943

Head girl Grace Fortnum - 'the school raised funds for their adopted M.T.Boat'.

School dinners cost 6d (two and a half pence) Hillside was a 'Secondary Modern'.

1946

The 'Hillsider' magazine was established. District Sports took place, the first since 1939.

Hillside won all the trophies. School Houses - 'Elgar''Burghley''Salisbury' 'Lister'.

1950s

Pupil Derek Allen took many photographs in the school.

1956

Hillside had great success in the Royal Society Easter exams.



1957

Pupil intake rose from 400 to 800 when it became 'Hillside Senior Mixed School'.

1960's

Paul Welsh pupil/prefect 1964-1970, by 1981 a school governor.

1966

Barry Smallwood was made Director of Music, his school band was very popular.

1970

Barry's music for 'The Golden Fleece' was performed by pupils.

1974

'The Hillside School' now an upper school.

1980s

The Sixth Form extended the school age to eighteen.

1982

The school had a very successful trip to Moscow.

1990s

'Five O' show celebrated fifty years of Hillside.

1995

Peggy Holloway, special needs teacher retired aged 82!

1997

A new sports hall and music suite were built.

1998

'The Hillsider' highlighted rumours of closure.

2000

The old three-tier system of lower, middle and upper schools was replaced by a new two-tier system resulting in middle schools Lyndhurst, Furzehill and Holmshill closing. Hillside and Hawksmoor upper schools also closed.

Tim Westrip, deputy, later Headmaster 1981-2000, departed. The Hillside School closed 31 August 2000.





Who can use the Borehamwood Foodbank?


Anyone who is struggling to feed themselves or their family. You do not need to be at a point of desperation to come to us. We all need a helping hand when going through difficult times.

War Memorials

Today the death of a single British soldier in some foreign conflict can make headline news but 100 years ago many thousands of young lives could be lost in a single day.

Next time you walk or drive past the war memorials on Elstree Hill or Shenley Road, both maintained by the town council, perhaps reflect on the young lives lost in the two world wars and subsequent engagements.

Today nobody is left alive who took part in what was then known as the Great War or what we recall today as the First World War. However, millions of young lives were extinguished in the First World War for what some argue today was pointless but which saw empires collapse, countries created and sadly sowed the seeds for another even worse world war 20 years later.



So great was the loss felt even in the small villages of Elstree and Boreham Wood that memorials were erected to the local lads who had died in the conflict.

On 14 July 1921 the Reverend A.R.T. Eales, rector of St Nicholas Church, Elstree from 1898 to 1945 dedicated the war memorial on Elstree Hill in the position it still occupies today.

The Boreham Wood memorial was originally dedicated on 20 October 1921 with the dedication 'erected to the memory of the men of this village who fell in the Great War'. It was sited at the top of Theobald Street adjoining the junction with Shenley Road but was relocated to its present position in 1957 due to the increase in traffic.

Sadly since then names have been added for the loss of local lads in the Second World War and subsequent conflicts.

To bring to life those etched names on granite why not visit the Elstree & Boreham Wood museum at 96 Shenley Road where you will find details of all those young local men who gave their lives to secure the future for all of us. Article by Paul Welsh


