Celebrating the Town's Film and Television Heritage

In our first issue we announced First Impressions, a project to celebrate the rich film and television history created right here on our doorstep.

Since then the project team has been working hard to begin to create a more attractive and exciting street scene from the gateway at the station, along Shenley Road to the Elstree Studios.

Last Summer the Town Crier invited local residents to vote for the film and TV greats who they wanted to see honoured. Over a thousand votes were cast, and stars for the top 11 actors placed in the revamped forecourt at the station.

The project team secured permission to display some of the most iconic film and TV images ever, and now banners featuring 12 different images line Shenley Road.

Meanwhile the plaques which the Town Council has awarded since 1996 have been cleaned and set on panels with added words and pictures.

This celebration of an extensive film and TV heritage "could only happen in Borehamwood" and so an empty shop window is being made-over with this theme. We hope this new display will be the first of many!

Since the last edition many of you may be wondering what has been happening with the planned community complex designed to replace the Village Hall.

HCC and church representatives have now agreed terms to enable the creation of the new community resource on the site of the old church halls. The project came about through creative partnership working with HCC, All Saints Church and Hertsmere Borough Council. Planning permission was granted late last year for a new building to accommodate a Library, Youth Connexions services, Town Museum, community and training facilities.

Building works should commence this summer to be ready for local community use autumn 2012. The Town Crier aims to bring

Young people make a positive impact

Did you know a team of young people are making a positive difference to your community?

Borehamwood and Elstree are benefiting from the skills of 30 young police cadets from across the borough who have been helping to make the area an even safer place to live, work and visit.

Since Hertsmere Volunteer Police Cadets (HVPC) launched in May 2010 its members have been involved in the Carnival Parade and Families Day, police station open day, Remembrance Sunday Parades and completed crime prevention surveys with the public.

Team building weekends and summer camps have helped them to improve their self esteem and confidence and most recently, 16 cadets passed a first aid training course – skills which they will now have for life and could be vital while carrying out their work in the community.

The cadets meet fortnightly and support the regular police in a range of duties, including helping to direct traffic and giving crime prevention advice. They were even part of a search team who helped to look for a vulnerable woman who was

missing from home.

Loran Kingston, volunteer cadets leader, explained: "The group is much more about young people getting together: the cadets have an input in police procedures and the law, learn great skills such as team building and leadership, as well as getting out and about in their communities and making a real difference to people's lives.

"One aim of the cadet scheme was to introduce positive activities for young people and it has been such a success. They have really developed into role models for others and are reaping the rewards of being a part of something so worthwhile."

These BfN Helpers are now volunteering in support groups across Hertsmere, including a weekly coffee morning at the Borehamwood and Elstree Children's Centre every Tuesday

morning from 10am-11.30am.

The DVDs run for a total of 35 minutes and demonstrate how easily people, especially the elderly or vulnerable, can be distracted or duped by unsavoury characters.

Richard is willing to attend any meetings you have coming up to show these important DVDs and answer any questions you might have.

Alongside the information, Hertsmere Borough Watch has a range of inexpensive security equipment which will be demonstrated if requested, or course there is no obligation to purchase either way.

At the heart of the community, Elstree and Borehamwood and the World

The Rotary Club of Elstree and Borehamwood has served the community for 69 years; its Charter was flown from America in 1942 in the bomb bay of a plane being delivered for service in World War 2!

Each year the Club usually joins in the Civic Festival by organising the Schools Art Show in the Village Hall. However, due to the redevelopment of the land at Shenley Road the event will take place at St Teresa's Parish Centre at Shenley Road and will be open for public viewing from Friday 1 July until Monday 4 July.

Many of us over 60 remember hearing that a member of our community was in an iron lung or had to wear leg callipers due to polio or infantile paralysis. Thankfully an early vaccine was introduced to this country in the 1950s and now a more advanced vaccine is given to all children in this country along with numerous others such as for measles, hooping cough etc.

However, although polio was eradicated from this country, children in many other countries continued to catch polio and were left with the unfortunate consequences. 26 years ago Rotary International decided this should not go on and set out to eradicate polio. Working with governments and the World Health Organisation (WHO), Rotary has slowly but steadily reduced the number of countries where polio remained endemic. Whereas at one time thousands of children would catch polio every day, in the whole of 2010 fewer than 500 children were reported to have caught polio in the entire world.

Several schools have raised money for Rotary's polio campaign and as a thank you the children have been presented with special bookmarks associated with the polio eradication campaign.

In February the Rotary Club held a musical celebration in Allum Hall; the audience was entertained by the choir of Summerswood School, the Com.Unity Choir, the Jim Phillips Jazz Group and the Borehamwood Brass Band. Although Rotary still needs further funds to purchase polio vaccine, the proceeds of the evening (£850) were donated to the British Polio Fellowship that looks after people who have lived with the after effects of polio caught before immunisation started in this country - over 120,000 of them.

> The Club has traditionally met on Thursday lunch times because Thursday was half day closing in the town and this made it easier for traders to attend meetings. Meetings are now much shorter than they were in 1942, running from 12-45 to 1-45.

General Community Services

Allotments

The Council has two allotment sites. Melrose Avenue continues to be well used, with no vacancies and a lengthy waiting list. The Allotment Holders Association takes an active interest in keeping it as clean and tidy as possible.

The Allum Lane site is under-used, with many of the original plots returned to a 'natural state'. However, the few allotment holders that remain there are still keen and interest in the site has increased in view of the waiting list for allotment plots, as such efforts will be made to restore some of the unused plots.

Planning

The Town Council is not the determining planning authority, but has a statutory right to be consulted on all applications within the area. The Environment and Planning Committee regularly meets to consider these.

The Council also considers and comments on other planning, transport and environmental matters affecting the town.

Transport And Road Safety Forum

The Tranport and Road Safety Forum has not met for several months but has re-formed for 2011/12.

Public Clocks

Town and Parish Councils have a discretionary power to maintain public clocks, and the Council currently meets the cost of maintaining the clocks on All Saints Church in Borehamwood and St Nicholas Church in Elstree.

Closed Churchyards, War Memorials and Street Seats

The Council continues to care for two closed churchyards in the town area (All-Saints and St. Nicholas) and to maintain the two war memorials. It also provides street seating and most of the seats were recently refurbished.

Grants and Loans

The Council assists organisations in the voluntary sector which provide services to and facilities for local residents. Applications for small grants and loans are considered bi-annually at Town Council meetings and awarded from an annual budget of £6000 set aside for this purpose. The next deadline for submitting an application is 9th November. Full details on grants, how to apply and an application form are available on the website - www.elstreeborehamwood-tc.gov.uk

Community Action for Hertsmere which provides the Community Shop receives an annual grant of £10,000 and the Council has also previously given support to the local museum.

Leisure and Entertainment

Fairway Hall

Our popular community hall has been open since 1986 and is used by a wide range of local groups. It is open 7 days a week attracting hirers for private functions from within the town and surrounding areas.

Coach Trips

The programme of coach outings to various destinations started in 1988 and continues to be a huge success with qualifying residents aged 60 or over.

New destinations are tried each year with over 600 people taking the opportunity to have an affordable day trip.

Christmas Decorations

Since the 1970s the Town Council has provided one of the best Christmas street decoration displays in North London and Hertfordshire. Following the introduction of the Health and Safety Code of Practice by Hertfordshire County Council, all of the lamp columns used by the Town Council have been made safe and an excellent display was put on during December in both Borehamwood and Elstree.

The Town Council continues to support the school swimming programme - as it has done since the late 1970s - in the belief that every local primary school child should have the opportunity to learn to swim. Most primary schools in the town now take advantage of this.

The Youth Council continues to engage actively with issues and concerns for young people and has Members on outside bodies giving a youth perspective on various issues. The Youth Council aims to raise its profile in the coming year by greater publicity and use of the internet.

Council Finances and Offices

The Council has had a difficult year in respect of staffing. Ted Foxon, our Handyman for years, sadly died unexpectedly in September and another member of staff has been on long term sick leave.

The Council has underspent on its Budget for the year 2010/2011 in relation to staffing costs and this has resulted in a reduced salaries budget.

Royal Borehamwood

The number of British and American film academy awards showered on The King's Speech' makes it the most successful film to come out of Elstree studios in its 85 years.

Other Elstree made movies such as Star Wars may have been a bigger hit at the box office but none have garnered so many awards around the world.

Little did actor Colin Firth know when he was portraying King George VI on the sound stages of Elstree that his real life counterpart had visited the same studio over 80 years earlier.

In 1929 the Duke of York was invited to visit the set of Blackmail, being directed by the new boy wonder of British cinema Alfred Hitchcock. Hitch had started the film as a silent movie but the craze for sound was sweeping the country so Elstree studios hastily erected a sound stage allowing sound sequences to be added.

The future King George watched some filming and saw first hand the difficulties encountered in those pioneering days. One such problem was that the star, Czech actress Anny Ondra, looked good on camera but her heavy accent made her an unlikely cockney girl. To avoid recasting the studio decided that an English actress would sit next to a microphone just off camera and speak the lines while Anny mimed the words! It was a success but Anny returned to making movies on the continent and married German world champion boxer Max Schmeling.

The Duke was accompanied by the Duchess of York who 22 years later would return as Queen Elizabeth with her daughter Princess Margaret to visit the set of The Magic Box starring Robert Donat and a host of guest stars. The film was being made to help celebrate the festival of Britain.

Her grandchildren were also destined to make royal visits to Elstree studios with Princess Anne officially opening the Maxwell building in 1985 and Prince Charles the new sound stages in 1999.

Another character featured in The King's Speech' was the future Edward VIII played by Guy Pearce. His real life counterpart when Prince of Wales made several private visits to the studio in the 1930s. To think how they all drove along Shenley road to go through the gates of this historic and world famous dream factory!


