

The Return of Kermit and Friends

When Jim Henson invented the Muppets in 1955 he could not have predicted the impact Kermit and his friends would have for so many of us around the world. Through his visionary use of abstract puppetry, crafting characters with a very human emotional capacity, he kept the boundless optimism and creativity of our childhood with us forever in our adult lives.

It is October 2015, inside BBC Elstree Studios, and Kermit the Frog is in an endearingly optimistic mood-as usual. He and the iconic Muppet troop have returned to visit their original TV home at Borehamwood for the first time in nearly 40 years. It's easy to forget just how much influence this studio, and the people, have had on Kermit and his internationally renowned gaggle of felted friends.

'In a way nothing has changed' affirms Kermit, fresh from a tour of the EastEnders set, 'It has always been the hard work of the artists & craftsman, including my best friend Jim Henson, that made it all happen. They move us & inspire us-they are so much more than people providing a helping hand.'

Filmed on Stage D in the original ATV studios, now BBC Elstree, from September 1976 to March 1981 with 5 series and 120 episodes The Muppet Show catapulted its puppet actors to superstardom. It wasn't always like this however.

'After appearing on Sesame Street we thought we'd get our own show' Kermit describes fondly the life changing deal with impresario Lew Grade, who offered the Muppets investment to run in syndication on the condition that it was filmed in England.'It was actually Britain who believed in us when no one else did' Kermit affirms.

The Muppet friends remained here to film 'The Great Muppet Caper' movie together in 1980 but left soon after, settling down in their native America. Kermit does miss Britain - which reminds him of his 'damp, boggy, swamplands' and remembers fondly the town of Elstree and Borehamwood.' We were all nervous about coming back after so long but I spent time with old friends and the town's inhabitants and realised, just like I did 39 years ago, that you are more like us than you know!'

Unveiling a Heritage Panel for Jim Henson

For over 100 years Elstree &

Borehamwood has been home to the British film industry and today its film and television studios are busier than for many years. Through its Film and Television Heritage Trail the town recognises the contribution of the many individuals who have helped create our unique legacy.

On Friday 26 October a heritage panel was added, celebrating the many contributions of Jim Henson, creator of "The Muppets", as well as feature-length films (including "The Dark Crystal", "Labyrinth" and "The Great Muppet Caper").

Former colleagues gathered on 16th October to share their memories of the man they still value as an inspirational creative leader but also a close friend. Martin Baker first met "The Muppets" while working as a Floor Manager at ATV and has since produced a variety of Muppetbased films and TV shows. "Jim was an extraordinary man to work with; I didn't really work for Jim Henson, I worked with him. He was like a surrogate father, and his legacy is indelible."

Writer and Producer Jocelyn Stevenson added her own tributes, followed by Louise Gold, the only English "Muppeteer". "I just feel so lucky. Jim loved what he did and he loved the people who worked with

him. He would push you, but whenever he said "That's not good enough" it was because he knew you could do better. I take that with me, the feeling that we're all trying to do our best."

BAFTA award-winner and Prop Master Barry Wilkinson then described working on Henson's feature film and cult classic, "Labyrinth".

This latest addition to the Heritage Trail was co-sponsored by Elstree & Borehamwood Town Council and its Youth Council. Mayor Richard Butler spoke of his surprise that Borehamwood had been home to "The Muppets". "You think you know a lot about your town and the community you live in but since becoming Mayor I've learned so much more. It's a privilege to remind people of the history of this town and everything that's going on, to put the history back into Elstree and Borehamwood. I hope we can continue to support that and I'm sure we will "

Youth Council Chair Jackie Warman testified to the continuing power of Jim Henson's creations to win new fans, saying that "The Muppets are part of our Heritage and our childhood. Living in Borehamwood I feel it's something we should all be very proud of."

On behalf of Elstree Screen Heritage and the First Impressions Project, Paul Welsh led a crowd of well-wishers to unveil the panel which now stands opposite McDonalds as a permanent reminder of the enduring legacy of Jim Henson.

Elstree and Borehamwood Museum has welcomed its 10,000th visitor since re-opening

The museum, which is now located in Borehamwood's community hub at 96 Shenley Road, rewarded David Nathan with a bottle of champagne when he walked through the door in September.

Founders of the museum Ann and Alan Lawrence, along with current museum manager David Armitage presented the bottle. David said: "It's a great achievement to reach 10,000 visitors, but we are always looking to produce new and exciting exhibitions to keep the visitors coming back."

Currently the museum is running an exhibition celebrating 30 years of EastEnders being filmed in the area. 'EastEnders at 30: In Our Manor' displays a range of iconic objects from the soap, including wedding dresses and gruesome murder weapons.

The exhibition, which is due to finish in January 2016, has been extremely popular and visitors have come from all over the UK to celebrate the anniversary of their favorite soap.

The museum is run entirely by volunteers and has seen visitor numbers soar since moving to the heart of Borehamwood in November 2013 from its previous home on Drayton Road.



Foodbank Carrier Bag Donation

On Thursday 25th September Elstree & Borehamwood Town Council and Symphony Environmental Ltd got together to donate a quantity of plastic bags to the Borehamwood Foodbank.

New legislation introduced in early October makes it compulsory for shops to charge for plastic bags which potentially interrupted the supplies from the local supermarkets of the much needed bags.

Town Councillors Pat Strack and Clive Butchins were on hand to present some new carrier bags along with Robert Bobroff from Symphony Environmental Ltd to Foodbank coordinator Kim Gray.



Kim Gray said "We'd like to thank Elstree & Borehamwood Council and Symphony Environmental Ltd for their generous donation of carrier bags to the Borehamwood Foodbank."

"We have been deeply touched by the generosity of local people and businesses and we are very grateful for your support."

The Foodbank is very low on food stock at the moment after a very busy summer and any food and carrier bag donations would be much appreciated.

To date the Foodbank has fed 4854 people - each having food for approximately 10 meals. This provides a crisis intervention while the local authority organise longer term solutions.

Christmas tree Tips

- 1. Bring your tree indoors as near to Christmas as you can. Until then, keep it in a cool, dry place away from sunlight.
- 2. Once it's indoors, position it away from radiators or fires, and away from sunlight coming in through windows.
- 3. With a potted tree, keep the compost moist but not wet. A cut tree is best displayed in a reservoir-type stand. First cut a 2cm-thick slice from the base, but don't whittle the sides down as the outer layers are the most efficient at taking up
- 4. You can put a potted tree in the garden, but place it in a greenhouse/shed first rather than moving outside straight from a warm house. It can grow very tall if removed from the pot.

Defibrillator Campaign

The Town Defibrillator Team have been very successful in their campaign working with the police, fire and ambulance services.

The team comprises Town Councillors Clive Butchins, Gary Silver, Eric Silver, Sandra Parnell and Pat Strack and Lawrence Stack, vice chair of EBRA. Gary and Eric Silver arranged donations of two defibrillators and a donation of £250 from pharmaceutical companies. Cllr Clive Butchins has produced a map identifying defibrillator locations in Elstree and Borehamwood. Clive has also produced the Defibrillator location signs.

On Friday 16th October, James Gillett, station manager for GOVIA, provided two free training sessions at 96 Shenley Road. Hertsmere Leisure, Library, Tesco Staff and others who will be working or volunteering where defibrillators are being installed took part. Each session lasted three hours and each attendee was certificated.

Defibrillator at 96

All Town Councillors attended the installation of a defibrillator on Wednesday 21st October at 7pm. A number of partners in the project took part including representatives from the police, fire and ambulance services, BETTA, CAH, EBRA and Elstree Screen Heritage.

The Commemorative Plaque was unveiled by Town Mayor Richard Butler. This defibrillator was purchased jointly by Hertsmere Leisure and Lawrence Stack. Lawrence has been busy collecting money for the

project. To date he has collected over £1,300, much of it from the Big Brother and "Strictly" queues.

In exchange for James Gillett doing the training, the team are putting in a defibrillator at Elstree and Borehamwood Station in November. The station is now manned 24/7 so access is guaranteed. The defibrillator at the station has been donated by the members of the Borehamwood Spiritual Centre based at Allum Lane Community Centre.

What do blind and partially sighted people want from the Talking Newspaper?

This was the issue discussed after the routine business of the Annual General Meeting of the Radlett, Elstree, Borehamwood and Shenley Talking Newspaper held on Tuesday 6th October at St John's Church in Radlett.

Borough Mayor, Cllr Martin Worster, with Mayoress, Pam Worster, and Cllr Richard Butler, Mayor of Elstree and Borehamwood, all enthusiastically joined in the lively discussion with volunteers of the organisation and its guests.

The Talking Newspaper has been running for over 35 years and for 30 of those years a weekly recording was sent to blind or partially sighted members of the community on audio cassettes. In 2010 the organisation changed over to USB memory sticks.

Each weekly recording has 30 minutes of local news from the Borehamwood Times and its sister paper, the Watford Observer, and 30 minutes of magazine items.

For a variety of reasons the number of listeners has fallen over the years; thankfully there have been major advances in the treatment of cataracts and some advances in the treatment of macular degeneration.

However, the organisation is now asking if the formula successfully used for 35 years needs revising; what do the listeners want? One answer is more good news but we have no control over that.

The chairman of the Talking Newspaper, David Clout, invites relatives, neighbours and friends of blind and partially sighted people to tell them about the current service available to them and to ask them what they would like in addition to local news.

Woodcock Hill Village Green AGM Chairman's Report Monday 19 October 2015

Special events

May 9th 2015 VE Day celebrations took place in conjunction with the E&B/wood Town Council and the Royal British Legion. The opening by Town Mayor Cllr Pat Strack and Hertsmere Mayor Cllr Carey and Mayoress Shirley Keates signalled the start of a lively afternoon of music from Borehamwood Brass, MCd by Paul Welsh and Nick Male.

Working parties

In the autumn 2014 Alex Melson joined the committee. He introduced the monthly working parties and drew up a Management Plan. These started with Mitzvah Day in November. During the year working parties cleared vegetation and rubbish. Volunteers built a dead hedge, a hibernaculum (which is a specially built underground den aimed at providing hibernation opportunities for a range of potential wildlife including slow worms, wood mice, frogs, newts and a lot of invertebrates) as well as the usual litter picking and bramble clearance. The erection of bat boxes supplied by Marlborough School in St Albans was a first for Woodcock Hill.

Next working Party Mitzvah Day 22nd November 10.30am to 1.30pm

When the campaign was won in 2008 for the land at Woodcock Hill to be a Village Green, the landowners remained the same: Taylor Wimpey (formerly Laings) and Mr Jacques Onona. The landowners did not lose the land but had no rights over it. The committee have the right to manage the area for 'lawful recreational use'. Brambles are cut back, rubbish is cleared and habitats are preserved. Dual use is encouraged for humans and the wildlife that abounds there.

Threats to WHVG a New Playground adjacent to Byron Ave

This was averted by the vigilance of the committee who spotted the project proposed by Hertsmere

proposed by Hertsmere
Borough Council and Taylor Wimpey to build a playground on WHVG.
The Open Spaces Society and our solicitor gave advice about the special legal status of Village Greens. Section 106 money will be paid by Taylor Wimpey for infrastructure improvement. This will now be spent on projects on WHVG as well as a revamp to the playground in Vale Ave. The committee will work with Hertsmere Borough Council Officers to decide the projects when the money becomes available.



Taylor Wimpey proposed that the former 9 acres (owned by Taylor Wimpey) of 'safeguarded' land at the bottom of Woodcock Hill be swapped from Village Green status to allow housing. The land swap would be with the 29 acres at the top of the hill at the corner of Furzehill Road and Barnet Lane. WHVG Committee voted to turn down this offer citing loss of amenity, difficulty with flooding, too much housing already in the area and pressure on roads and local infrastructure. At an EGM for residents this recommendation was unanimously accepted.
