The band were then welcomed at Boreham Wood Football Club where they signed t-shirts. The girl band had the privilege of holding the club's promotion trophy.



again. Since the end of June 2015 a new Big Local Rep has been working with the Partnership to find a new Locally Trusted Organisation, increase the number of members on the Partnership and to refresh the Big Local Plan.

In December 2015 Affinity Sutton was appointed as the Locally Trusted Organisation and is very excited to be partnering with Leecliffe Big Local. There are now 13 members on the Partnership which has more than doubled since June 2015. Consultation is taking place across the Big Local area to develop a new Big Local Plan and we have had a positive response from residents of all ages. By Spring 2016 a Big Local Worker will have been appointed by Affinity Sutton and they will work closely with the Leecliffe Big Local Partnership to deliver the new plan.

Leecliffe Big Local is aiming to submit their new plan to Local Trust at the end of March 2016. Between January and March 2016 the Partnership will be delivering a number of workshops with Stakeholders to develop project ideas in response to the comments residents have made during the consultation. The Partnership is keen to commission some local organisations to deliver aspects of their new plan to ensure the Big Local investment benefits everyone in the Big Local area.

# Elstree Screen Heritage 10 Years and still going strong

In Elstree & Borehamwood there are always anniversaries to celebrate. 2014 marked 100 years since the first local film studio (Neptune) opened its doors, and in 2016 Elstree Film Studios will celebrate 90 years of film-making on its site.

2015 had its own reasons to celebrate: 35 years since Stanley Kubrick made "The Shining" and 60 years since the classic British film "The Dam Busters" was first shown.

But for Elstree Screen Heritage 2015 marked 10 years since we came together "to record, preserve and share the unique local heritage of film and television production".

So what have we achieved in that time? "Seeing is believing" and we've held 43 screenings of film and TV, either made in the local studios or, in the case of our own Centenary Documentary, made about the local studios.

We've arranged other events over the years: A Movie Quiz in 2009, An Evening of Movie Memories (2012) and several film and TV-themed performances by the BBC Elstree Concert Band. In 2013 we even set off in a Routemaster bus to visit local film locations which have "starred" in film and TV.

When the new Community Museum opened in November 2013 we were there to unveil our interactive screens, "the ESH Wall". And in 2014 we transformed the Museum for three months with a high impact Centenary Exhibition, featuring memorabilia, extracts from interviews with studio "veterans" and even an Oscar and a BAFTA award!

To help us reach a wider audience we've set up our web site and Facebook site. Paul Welsh has written "Elstree Confidential" and we've also created "Made At Elstree", our guide to the past 100 years, PLUS a special Centenary Souvenir edition of "Town Crier".

A founder member of the multi-agency "First Impressions" Project, since 2008 Elstree Screen Heritage has helped to improve local public spaces and raise awareness of our heritage through an ambitious programme, including: signage and the wall mural at the rail station as well as stars in the pavement and planting, 27 panels in a new Film & TV Heritage





Trail, plus street banners on lamp standards and new signage at key "gateways" to the Town Perhaps the most important asset we have is the archive of over 65 interviews which we built in partnership with the Film & TV Course at the University of Hertfordshire since 2010. These interviews with the men and women who helped create local film and TV are being made available on-line to everyone, free of charge.

Another way Elstree Screen Heritage has spread its message has been to give talks to local groups. Since 2009 we've made 160 presentations, raising more than £5,000 in donations to help fund our activities.

Through the efforts of our volunteers since May 2005, Elstree Screen Heritage has worked hard to raise the profile of 100 years of local film and TV. But heritage is more than history; both Elstree Film Studios and the BBC Elstree Centre are now as busy as ever, ensuring that Elstree & Borehamwood continues to be "the home of UK film and television".

There's still so much more to do, and we look forward to presenting new ideas in the spring at our AGM. Here's to the next 10 years; and "May the Force Be with Us!"

# Community Safety Partnership (CSP) meetings

Changes have been made to the Elstree and Borehamwood CSP and meetings will take place every four months instead of three. There are now three local CSPs in Hertsmere reduced from four. Radlett and Bushey have been amalgamated as have Shenley and Potters Bar.

The new chair is Rodney Burt. Rodney has lived in Borehamwood several years now. He is a museum volunteer and part of the Napoleonic Reenactment Society. Rodney helps with light and sound for amateur groups including Elstree Productions.

### **EVPS**

# The Elstree Village Preservation Society is an off shoot of the Elstree and Borehamwood Green Belt Society.

The EBGBS has always had the protection of the Elstree Village Conservation Area as part of it's remit. The EVPS was formed in June and has met monthly to look at what is impacting on the Village. A map was drawn to show boundaries of what most affected the Conservation area.

The Committee then prioritised what would be tackled in the short term:
Parking, A village Identity, the impact of loss of Aldenham reservoir, Reviva Recycling Centre on Elstree Hill south, The Holly Bush, The Plough and The Waggon and Horses.



# **A Village Identity**

Signage welcoming people to Elstree Village will play an important part in proclaiming the separate identity of Elstree Village.

This is ongoing but this year Elstree Cross Roads has Christmas lights and a flagpole Xmas tree at Schopwick Place. Next year the Town Council will consult the EVPS about Xmas Street lights and decorations.

#### **Aldenham Reservoir**

The loss of access around the lake would be a blow to the whole community EVPS with EBGBS and others will campaign hard for a solution to save the lake, the dam and its environs.

We await developments in 2016.

# Reviva Green Waste recycling

There has been a constant stream of complaints about this HCC owned site being mismanaged to the detriment of not only village residents but people living further afield.

The stench coming from the site is at times unbearable. Letters have been written to Reviva and County Councillor Caroline Clapper and a meeting arranged to try to solve this.

The Holly Bush has been allowed to deteriorate, this is a grade 2 listed building. EVPS alerted HBC and the enforcement officer has been in negotiations with the owner about keeping the building in good condition. At the time of writing the Holly Bush is up for auction.

The Plough restaurant is under new management. Kiss Kiss opened in November as an Italian Restaurant and is doing well.

The Waggon and Horses. This listed building continues as a public house and eatery.





# **Defibrillator Project**

# From an idea by Lawrence Stack a Project team was set up in June 2015.

The team, including co-ordinator Cllr. Pat Strack and Cllr. Sandra Parnell, have been busy working to deploy life-saving AEDs (Automatic External Defibrillators) around Elstree and Borehamwood. Units have already been deployed at 96 Shenley Road, with half of the cost being collected by Lawrence Stack and the balance from Hertsmere Leisure. The Defibrillator at Elstree & Borehamwood Station was donated by the Borehamwood Spiritual Centre and inaugurated on 11th November 2015. Lawrence has also collected enough to fund an AED at Aberford Hall.

Two AEDs and several hundred pounds have been donated by contacts of the ClIrs Eric and Gary Silver, as well as £,1000 each from local companies Taylor Wimpey and Bio Products Laboratory. These efforts will enable units to be deployed at Fairway Hall, the Community Shop, the BECC and at the Hertswood Centre. The Venue will benefit from a defibrillator thanks to a grant from the Hertsmere Health and Wellbeing fund.

A successful application to the British Heart Foundation for three defibrillators along with training materials was followed up by Cllr Clive Butchins after a suggestion from Lawrence. These are earmarked for Allum Hall, Morrison and Tesco.

Much thanks goes to accredited trainer James Gillett for providing several free training sessions for staff and others from the places where units are being installed. More training sessions are being organised so that as many people as possible will have the confidence to make use of an AED. If you think that you or someone you know would benefit from training please let us know.

We continue to have excellent and invaluable support from Council staff and the police, fire and ambulance emergency services. The map you see has been created and updated so as many people as possible can see where defibrillators are located and in an emergency as much time as possible can be saved in their deployment. It will be displayed on Town notice boards (watch out for the new one being erected at the station) and other public places.

The launches of all 9 defibrillators will be made in February. For 2016 we are looking forward to working with schools and sports clubs. If anyone would like to support this project by making a donation please contact any member of the team. Any donation, however small, will be most welcome.

The Defibrillator Team is Town Councillors Clive Butchins, Eric Silver, Gary Silver, Sandra Parnell and Pat Strack (co-ordinator) and Lawrence Stack EBRA.

Launch and installation at 96, Lawrence Stack paid 50% and Hertsmere Leisure paid 50%. The train station defibrillator was paid for by The Borehamwood Spiritual Centre and installed back in October.

Gary and Eric Silver had two defibrillators and several hundred pounds donated through their connections with pharmaceutical companies. Eric has written to local companies and has secured donations of £1k each from Taylor Wimpey and Bio Products. These will go into Fairway Hall, the Community Shop and the BECC.

Pat secured a grant for £1,500 from the Health and Well Being Fund to install a defibrillator at The Venue.

Clive has successfully applied for three defibrillators and cases from the British Heart Foundation. These will go into Allum Hall, Tesco and Morrisons

Lawrence has collected enough money to have a defibrillator installed at Aberford Hall.

James Gillet, station manager for Thameslink, is an accredited trainer and has been providing a certificated course for staff, volunteers and others where defibrillators are being installed. We continue to have excellent support from the town staff, police, fire and ambulance services.

Clive is constantly updating the map of defibrillator locations. These will go on display in GP surgeries, town notice boards, community centres and other places around the town.

In 2016 the team will be working with schools and sports clubs.



# **Helping the Rough Sleepers**

# This year staff at Sainsbury's depot in York Way wanted to do something to help the local community.

Shoeboxes containing goods for the homeless was suggested. Town Councillor Victor Eni contacted Town Councillors Sandra Parnell and Pat Strack. They were pleased to accept the gifts for the rough sleeper project to be given out on 23/12/15 at 96. A Christmas lunch was cooked and several agencies were present to help the rough sleepers.

At this time of the year there are some people sleeping rough in the Town. This was brought to our attention by PCSOs. It is cold and wet and the idea emerged of providing a hot Xmas lunch. 96 provided the hall and kitchen free of charge. Crackers were provided by the church. Many other agencies were involved. Sasha Capocci and Marion Joyce, Tesco community Champion, helped with the meal.

In the New Year we are hoping to set up a project to help the homeless with assistance from Emmaus and other agencies. Emmaus is a Europe wide organisation with independent groups working as independent self-funding units. The St. Albans Emmaus group provides

accommodation for up to 34 with Individual rooms and three family homes of three bedrooms. The homeless can stay as long as they need until they are back on their feet. All have to come off benefits, be drug and alcohol free and get a weekly allowance of £34. Accommodation and food are provided. All have to help with the running of the former nurses home and all help with the business.

Emmaus is self-funding because it collects, renovates and sells furniture. There are five shops in St. Albans, Hemel Hempstead and Barnet. Residents can learn a number of skills connected with restoring furniture and mending electrical goods, working in the kitchen garden or maintaining the huge grounds. Working in the shop, driving the van collecting and delivering furniture and cashing up are all other skills that will help the residents to get back into work. Some are even encouraged to attend college courses. Their self-confidence and self-esteem is restored and they become useful valued members of society.



# **Top 10 tips**for staying healthy this winter

- Have the flu vaccine: it's free for over 65s, pregnant women, two and three year-olds, those with existing health conditions and carers – contact your GP or practice nurse. If you are not in one of these groups you can get one for around £10 at many supermarkets and pharmacies. Some pharmacies offer jabs free on the NHS.
- 2. Heat your home to at least 18C, it can help to minimise health risks. If heating your whole home is a problem, heat your living room during the day and your bedroom just before you go up to sleep.
- 3. If you can, get up and move around. If your mobility is limited, do some chair exercises to help you stay warm and active.
- 4. Good grips: if you need to go outside wear shoes with slip resistant, good grip soles.
- Hot food and warm drinks: Keep well fed and hydrated. Drink lots of water as well as warm drinks.
- Stock up on basics like soup, tinned fish, long life milk and medicines such as paracetamol and ibuprofen in case you can't get out of your home for a couple of days.
- 7. Undertake energy efficiency improvements to your home or encourage your landlord to do so.
- 8. Keep a list of useful and emergency contacts by your phone also add local organisations and charities who support older people. A list of useful contacts is available on the HertsHelp website.
- 9. Look out for friends and neighbours, particularly the elderly, those with existing health conditions and young children.
- 10. Keep tissues with you and use them to catch coughs or sneezes then bin them and kill the germs by washing your hands.


On Wednesday 16th December 80 members and friends of DR96 enjoyed a full Turkey Xmas dinner at 96.


