The programme promises a selection box of musical delights, drawing on seasonal favourites from the worlds of screen, stage, classical music and popular tunes following their sell-out success with Music From The Movies in July.

Theatre Manager Tom Lagden commented: 'We're delighted to welcome The BBC Elstree Concert Band back to The Ark. It's going to be the perfect show to begin December and get everyone in to the festive spirit.'

Over the twenty-five years of their existence, the Band has played at a wide range of venues in and around London as well as at both Dorchester and Westminster Abbeys. Further afield their travels have taken in France, Germany and Belgium but Elstree and Borehamwood remains very much their spiritual home.

Founded by flautist Ian Marshall, their first public concert was at the BBC's Elstree Studios in July 1986 and since then the Band has returned to Borehamwood yearly and gained a loyal audience. With tunes everyone can hum or tap their feet to their most recent visit is due to offer more magical music.

The continued development of the Band into the versatile and entertaining ensemble they are today is down to the inspirational and energetic leadership of two people: the founding Musical Director, Mike Crisp, and the current Musical Director, Andrew Morley. **Exam Success all round for** Hertsmere Academy

Students of Hertsmere Academy of Dance and Performing Arts, based at Fairway Hall, are celebrating after receiving outstanding results for their Imperial Society of Teachers of Dance (ISTD) Tap, Modern and Jazz exams. With ages ranging from 5 to 18 years of age, 98% gained top marks with Distinction and the remaining 2% with High Merit.

All 7 advanced examinations resulted in Distinction; this is very rare for such high level examinations. Hertsmere Academy still holds its record 100% examination pass rate since it opened in Borehamwood in 1982 by Diane Parks.

Principal Chahna Morgan, Qualified teacher of the ISTD and Royal Academy of Dance (RAD) and a professional dancer who performed at the Olympic Opening Ceremony said: "I am so proud of my students and their achievements, I only hope that this encourages more people to take part as dancing is fun, creative and great exercise."

Exams are extremely beneficial for students as they help them gain UCAS points for universities and they also develop students physically and mentally.

Chahna continued "We're now preparing for the RAD Ballet exams in November and in January our Youth Musical Theatre production

company 'Inspiring Productions' will be holding open auditions for the community to take part in our Junior Musical".

The very strong Women's Section began its work in 1921 after the First World War, when women wanted to "do their bit", after all throughout the war they had had to do the work of men and they wanted to continue to work to care for others less fortunate, the widows and their families in particular. Sadly even today most of the calls on the Legion are for financial welfare. Allowances can be paid by The Women's Section Welfare Programme to assist women who have served or were married to servicemen, also the children of service and ex-service personnel who are experiencing difficulties. The Women's Section can also provide educational sponsorship mainly for young children and family welfare breaks for those devastated families after a bereavement or when even just a short holiday break would be beyond their means.

The Women's Section are especially noticeable every year from mid-October to mid November. During this time all their fundraising goes to the Poppy Appeal rather than to their Welfare Schemes.

There are many ways Borehamwood's Women's Section enjoy their fund raising, quizzes, raffles, bingo, collection of spare change, a regular stall on Families Day are just a few.

## **Youth Council**


Since the last Town Crier lots of progress has been made within the Youth Council.
