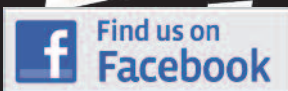
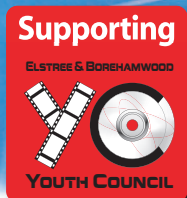

Tickets are £6.50 and concessions £4, available from The Ark Theatre or the Town Council Offices.

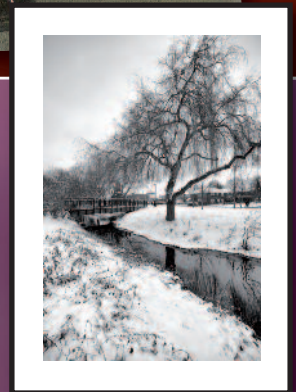

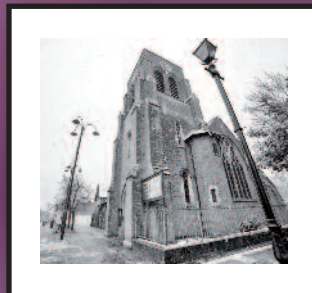

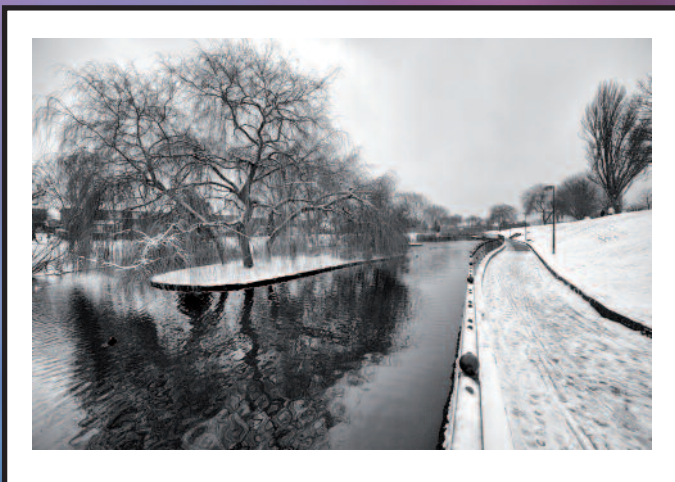

Bee Keeping Seminar

On a chilly night in mid January, some thirty-five Members of the Public huddled in Fairway Hall to participate in a fascinating public seminar hosted by the Town Council on the topic of Bee Keeping.

Peter Kennedy of the St Albans Beekeepers Association spoke very eloquently and with the aid of a number of displays and items of beekeeping equipment to provide an overview of what was involved in the hobby and the science behind it. The Council is also hugely grateful to a local expert, Andrew Fiaca, who shared his 35 years worth of experience of bee keeping and honey making in the local area.

So how did the night come about? In the late Summer of last year the Council conducted a consultation exercise with plot holders at the Allum Lane Allotment site to test the temperature of feeling about introducing or permitting bee keeping facilities on the site. The response was overwhelmingly enthusiastic with 80% of those responding actively supporting the proposal.

Despite this persuasive statistic it is not an activity the Council would want to rush into without knowing all the facts. The purpose of the seminar, therefore, was to find out a little more from those who knew best and also to bring the Community into that process as well.

Through the Environment and Planning Committee, the Council will be looking carefully to see how best to help interested parties in getting involved. 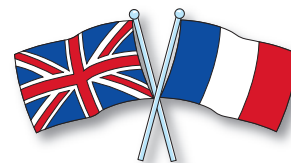

The Leeming / Aycliffe Big Local Project

As a resident of Borehamwood, you may recall that the area identified as Leeming/ Aycliffe was selected by the Big Lottery to be one of the first fifty Big Local communities to benefit from an investment of £1,000,000 over a period of up to ten years. You may also be wondering what has been happening since the announcement was made more than a year ago?



Well, a lot of preparatory work has been undertaken to ensure that this investment contributes to long lasting, positive and meaningful change for the residents of the target area. Community Action Herts was initially commissioned to get people together and get them involved in designing a programme and processes that would give residents a voice in identifying key issues and options for delivering projects that could impact on these to promote positive change. As a result, more than 1100 people gave their views which contributed to the production of a Community Profile. During this consultation phase people were also asked to indicate their willingness to be further involved and as a result a Community Partnership was established consisting of local residents.

CAH continues to work with the Partnership to devise a Community Plan and Vision which has identified areas of activity in response to the key issues identified in the Profile. The Community Partnership will not be operating in isolation in taking this plan forward and is currently in the process of establishing a Community Forum and Advisory Panel to ensure as wide a range of views as possible can be taken into consideration every step of the way.

The Community Forum will meet several times per year and membership is open to anyone living, working or studying in the target area to share their opinions or become involved in the delivery of projects.

The Advisory Panel will consist of representatives of key service providers to ensure expertise is captured, duplication and waste is minimised and opportunities for joint working are maximised.

A lot of work has been undertaken so far, but the future is looking good... if you would like to find out more or if you want to attend the Forum or offer your expertise to the Partnership why not pop into the Community Shop for the Big Local Coffee morning any Monday (10am to 12pm) or email the Partnership Chair, Donna Inwood (info@leemingandaycliffebiglocal.org.uk). Precept 2013/14

Continuing our commitment to value for money

Recognising the difficult economic climate for residents at the present time, for the third year running, the Town Council has decided not to raise the Precept for the forthcoming financial year.

The Precept is the Town Council's share of the Council Tax and represents the major source of income for the authority to carry out all of its functions and services and to put on all the events for the Town.

The Council receives no income at all from Central Government but does support the work of other bodies who also draw from the Council Tax in supporting their services (for example part funding a PCSO (Hertfordshire Constabulary), additional Library Hours (Hertfordshire County Council) and High Street Planters (Hertsmeire Borough Council) to name but a few). Elsewhere in this newsletter, you will read about the £28,000 worth of grant monies awarded by the Council over the past year and the budget for 2013/14 has not changed insofar as the availability of grant monies is concerned to support the work of local groups that benefit the Community directly.

Council Members are acutely aware that increasing demands and rising costs on the Town Council are putting pressures on our ability to continue operating as we are and so a root and branch review of the authority's financial arrangements is being undertaken with a mid and

long term plan being developed to ensure that we can carry on delivering the improvements and services that you need and deserve from this level of Local Government.

We pride ourselves on delivering the very best value for money services that we can, but we will not compromise on our core values which include the quality of what we do and the happiness and wellbeing of our Communities.

Once again, therefore, in 2013/14 the cost to the Band D Council Tax Payer in Elstree and Borehamwood for all Town Council services and events will remain at £24.12 per year (or 50p per week). This represents just 2p of every pound in the total Council Tax share.

Making a Good First Impression



November and December saw the addition of another four panels to the local Film and TV Heritage Trail.

Hertsmere Borough Mayor Cllr. Pat Strack kindly unveiled panels at the Studio Plaza housing development now being completed on the site of MGM British Studios.

One panel starts to tell the story of these world-famous studios where 2001: A Space Odyssey, The Dirty Dozen and many other classic films were made. Director Stanley Kubrick's Executive Producer and brother-in-law, Jan Harlan, added his own memories of MGM.

The other panel explains the film and TV-based names which have been given to 35 local streets. The Start Plaque (see below) is located at the junction of Studio Way and Elstre Way. Is your street one of these?

One month later the Mayor attended an unveiling at Imperial Place, the site of B & D (British & Dominions) Studios.

One panel describes the home of Oscar-winning The Private Life of Henry VIII while the other celebrates the careers of local husband and wife film team, Dame Anna Neagle and Herbert Wilcox.

Our main goal for 2012 was to increase membership; this was achieved by producing new promotional material and increasing efforts with recruitment, we are very pleased at the success we had with this and we attracted many new members (But we'd still like more!)

During 2012 the Youth Council got involved with many different projects and initiatives, we were lucky enough to have a guided tour of the famous Elstree Film Studios, we helped with a local countryside clean up and we helped at the Queen's diamond Jubilee celebrations.

However, these children also lack basic school equipment such as exercise books and pens. Many need t-shirts, shorts, dresses and skirts.

The Rotary Club of Elstree and Borehamwood has adopted the Mary's Meals Backpack Project that aims to send filled backpacks to African countries to enable children to get an education.

The expected list of items for the contents of a backpack is: backpack/school bag, exercise book/notepad, pencils, pens, crayons, eraser, ruler, pencil sharpener, pencil case, towel, shorts/skirt and t-shirt or dress, flip flops/sandals, small ball e.g. tennis ball, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, metal spoon.



Any of the items are needed but the Club particularly seeks from parents outgrown clothes that are still in good condition and redundant football strips.
