Working with you to make a bigger difference

Communities 1st cancer event attracts hundreds

On 29 March 2023, Communities 1st hosted a Health and Cancer Awareness event at Aberford Community Centre in Borehamwood. It was their most popular public event to date, with over 170 members of the local community, four GP surgeries, and three national charities among those in attendance.

The event was organised for the Our Health Matters project, which is part of the nationwide Core20PLUS5 initiative, an NHS scheme aiming to tackle health inequalities in specific areas of deprivation across the UK. The Our Health Matters project focuses on Hertsmere because research has shown that residents are not always well-supported by existing health services. Local people often experience inequalities of access and experience, especially with early cancer diagnosis, hypertension, respiratory disease, and severe mental illness. This event was held to raise local awareness of cancer and general health topics.

Stephen Craker, CEO of Communities 1st said: "We're pleased to be able to provide a space where Hertsmere residents could equip themselves with knowledge of the signs and symptoms of cancer. We are now planning an event for later in the year for local people to find out more information on a range of respiratory conditions."

The event comprised four talks by representatives from Prostate Cancer UK, Cancel Out Cancer, CoppaFeel! and Hertfordshire Health Walks. These representatives also hosted information stalls, along with Macmillan Cancer Support, Peace Hospice Care, Healthy Hubs Hertfordshire, Fairbrook Medical Centre, Schopwick GP Surgery, Manor View Practice at Theobald Surgery, The Grove Medical Centre, a Health Protection Nurse, and Communities 1st. The general practice staff checked blood pressures, booked NHS Health Checks and blood tests, signposted and made referrals to physiotherapists, social prescribers, mental health services, weight management and other wellbeing services.

Members of the public left the event with not only increased awareness of health and cancer, but information about other services such as

transport, befriending and walking groups. One

attendee, the carer of an elderly person with cancer, said it was good to be able to talk to so many expert organisations in one place. Others found the event very relaxed, and felt the talks made cancer feel like less of a taboo subject.

Mike Carn OBE, volunteer presenter with Cancel Out Cancer: "I hope those who heard the presentation went away feeling more confident in talking about cancer and took the message that early diagnosis can save lives back to family and friends."

Communities 1st will hold a Health and Respiratory Awareness event on 14 June 2023 from 1 - 4pm at Aberford Community Centre which will be attended by Asthma and Lung UK.

Compost Corner

One Straw Revolution

I've been thinking about soil health for a good few years, but not really doing much about it – mulling over many approaches including the so-called 'no dig' method expounded by Charles Dowding, and recently reading Masanobu Fukuoka's revolutionary discussion 'The One Straw Revolution', about a cultivation practice making the most of the natural balance found in nature, and no need for pesticides or fertilizer use.

Life does seem to bring about a convergence of ideas and circumstances so this year it's all happening! Firstly, I happened upon several sources of cardboard (office deliveries, and neighbours moving



in/redecorating) which were laid down overlapping

across the plot, then a thick layer of straw and a good watering, and a scattering of manure – horse and chicken. I'll be scooping up the grass trimmings too, and adding anything else I come upon that will help produce a nutrient rich mulch. I'm told this will produce an excellent rich soil for the coming year's veg, and this is when the no-dig practice will kick in. If you want to know more, I suggest you do your own research, and look out for this year's Civic Festival Allotment Open Day – come and see how it's getting on!

In our new regular feature, 'Cowley Hill Writes' we are highlighting the fantastic young authors we have right here in our school.

All of our children produce high quality writing throughout the week and this is a chance for us to showcase their talent. Each week we choose a piece of excellent writing from EYFS/KS1 and KS2 and display it in our newsletter, as well as on a display board in school for everyone to see. On Friday 3 February, students collected one point for every correct answer entered over the course of a one-hour duration. A massive 2,895 schools participated across the United Kingdom which equates to 17,285 different classes. When the points were totalled on Friday evening, Cowley Hill came out with a total score of 75,495 correct answers ranking us at 161st place – this means we successfully overcame the competition of 2,735 other primary schools!

World Book Day It was another fantastic World Book Day at Cowley Hil.

Lots of famous and interesting literary characters appeared through our doors along with their favourite books or props. Children had an enjoyable assembly where they sang a World Book Day rap and shared their favourite stories and characters, as well as completing live lessons



with an author or other exciting World Book Day themed activities. An excellent day was had by all.

Year 6 meet World War Two veterans at Duxford

Our year 6 classes were lucky enough to visit the Imperial War Museum's Duxford site.

The day presented a fantastic opportunity to further develop their understanding of their current focus upon World War Two. The incredible exhibitions were enjoyed by the children and adults chance would also place their visit on the same day as rehearsal for an air show took place!

Aside from exploring the site, they also had the pleasure of sitting down to talk with two veterans of the armed forces; Robert Johnson, who was 5 when war broke out in 1939 and he witnessed

the Blitz and flying bombs falling on the capital. Robert is also a veteran because he did his National Service in the Army during the 1950s. The children also met John Kershaw, who is also an eyewitness to World War Two - he grew up in North London and was aged 3 when the war broke out in 1939. John served in the RAF during his National Service.

The questions asked by the children to further their own level of understanding were praised and demonstrated their attention to detail throughout their learning opportunities in school.



News from Borehamwood Brass

BBC Elstree Concert Band

The BBC Elstree Concert Band was founded by flautist Ian Marshall and gave its first public concert at the BBC's Elstree Studios in July 1986.

The audience was a modest one but included, crucially, the Mayor of Elstree and Borehamwood and the Town Council's Entertainments Officer. The Town Council's support over subsequent years has been vital to the band's development. Indeed, Elstree and Borehamwood remains very much the band's spiritual home, where it regularly gives concerts.

The continued development of the band into the versatile and entertaining ensemble you will hear today is down to the inspirational and energetic leadership of two people: the founding Musical Director, Mike Crisp, and the current Musical Director, Andrew Morley.

Mike Crisp was a pillar of the BBC's TV Training Department and composer of a considerable amount of music for television programmes. He assumed the responsibilities of Musical Director from a very early stage and continued for many wonderful years until his departure for pastures new in France. His successor, Andrew Morley, has continued to take the band from strength to strength, pushing players to new levels with great exuberance!

Over the thirty plus years of the band's existence, it has played at a wide range of venues in and around London, including the Elstree and Maida Vale Studios, St James's Church Piccadilly, The Proms at

in Meadow Park. This is an outdoor event so we hope for warm dry weather.

St Jude's in Hampstead Garden Suburb, Millfield Theatre, Allum Hall, Dorchester and Westminster Abbeys. The ensemble has also given concerts further afield in Belgium, Germany and France.

The band's performances have been broadcast nationally as well as globally through the BBC World Service. The band provided the music for a major BBC 1 documentary and has made several recordings, the most recent of which was for a Radio 3 programme on the music of Charles Ives, as part of the "Discovering Music" series. - Local heritage assets are identified and conserved for future generations.
- Making the most of our links to the television and film industry.
- Telling the story of our area how it has evolved and the communities who have settled here.
- Reinforcing our identity and sense of place.

Objective 3: Providing homes to meet the needs of the local community:

- Supporting the provision of affordable homes.
- Influencing new housing that caters for occupants throughout their different stages of life.
- Designing quality neighbourhoods that enable exemplary sustainable design.

• Directing new housing to the most sustainable parts of the area, near to local facilities.

Objective 4: Enabling a thriving economy:

- Revitalising the town centre as a safe, friendly and accessible destination offering a mix of retail, housing, local services and entertainment, including into the evening.
- Supporting the television and film industry with greater involvement in the local community and provision of facilities.
- Safeguarding existing employers, including the medical/pharma industries.
- Providing a supportive environment for those working from home.

Objective 5: A walkable and cyclable neighbourhood (a 20-minute town?):

- Encourage walking and cycling, particularly for local journeys.
- Enhancing the network of walking and cycling routes that link key services to housing and ensuring that new developments connect to this.

Objective 6: Celebrating and supporting our communities:

- Providing a range of facilities, services and recreational activities to meet the needs of different ages, cultures and interests across the area.



Muay Thai is a Thai martial art known as 'the science of 8 limbs' because participants strike with not only their fists and feet, but also their knees and elbows. Competitors fight in boxing rings, with hypnotic traditional music playing while the air fills with the pungent menthol smell of the oil Thai boxers use to warm up their muscles.

I knew none of this when I turned up at a class at Barnet Combat Academy seven years ago on a whim. I walked past the gym every day on my commute, and one day my curiosity got the better of me. I had no idea I'd fall for the sport so quickly, and that I'd find myself squeezing in as many sessions a week as possible.

There's a preconception that sports like Muay Thai are only for those brave souls who want to fight competitively. Muay Thai is for those people, of course, but it can also be for those who prefer their faces unpunched. It's an unparalleled workout: a pad training session a few times a week will increase your strength and fitness fast.

But it wasn't just the workout that hooked me - it was the community I found at the gym. When lockdown struck, our Zoom shadow-boxing classes kept me sane. I found a club that was at the heart of its local community: through the gym I've not only made new friends, I've taken part in community festivals, and I've seen the voluntary work our coaches do, such as working with local young people through the charity Art Against Knives.

In the last seven years I've seen a move to a larger premises, an expanded timetable, and now new classes in Borehamwood, growth which is a testament to the gym's ties to the local community.

Save Woodcock Hill Village Green from Taylor Wimpey

Andrew Grady and I met Oliver Dowden to object to Barratt Homes intentions to build on the Horses Home BE6.

A week later the Planning Inspectorate caused even more distress by upholding the Public Inquiry decision allowing Taylor Wimpey to take away part of our cherished Village Green. Green Belt land at Byron/ Vale/Masefield is also a local wild life site. Wishes of residents were completely overridden, biodiversity ignored. Our legal team are seeking permission to appeal.

Both Oliver Dowden MP and Cllr Morris Bright have not only shared our disappointment but will help us to challenge the decision.



"I am incredibly disappointed to hear that a Judge has upheld the Planning Inspectorate's decision to approve the Deregistration and Exchange of village green land at Woodcock Hill in Borehamwood.

My opposition was clear throughout the process, writing to the Secretary of State and the Planning Inspectorate to register my objections, as well as responding to the initial consultation." Oliver Dowden MP.

"I know the WHVG Committee fought hard against this. I commend them for all their hard work. I will continue to work closely with them to do all we can to resist these plans. Having lived in Borehamwood

for almost 35 years I am both deeply saddened and upset about the decision." Cllr Morris Bright.

All who have visited Woodcock Hill know what a hugely important part of the community's identity it has become. So much effort by so many people over a long period to see this site protected and now some of that protection is lost. It is a special place held in the hearts of many Borehamwood residents.

The effort of the WHVG Committee and volunteers should be highlighted as a clear example of the local community coming together to stop an injustice.

The Town Council site warden team has recently taken delivery of a new 100% electric van on a 5-year deal to replace the previous diesel vehicle and to help cut the carbon emissions in the town.

With a range of approx. 175miles, the new van is ideal for the short journeys the Town Council Site Warden Team does around the town at the Allotment Sites, Churchyards and supporting the Town Council events.

The Town Council has also installed 2 x 22kw electric vehicle charging points adjacent to Fairway Hall for public charging.

The Town Council are currently charging 22p/Kwh. More information is available on BeeCharged by scanning the QRCode on the Charging post or going to www.beecharged.com





Mayor's Summary

[Summing up at the Annual Council Meeting], the Town Mayor, Councillor Sandra Parnell said "I have had a very special Mayoral Year. Coming out of the pandemic restrictions, events were able to be held and the highlight of my mayoralty was the Queen's Platinum Jubilee when we hosted visitors from France and Germany, the Deputy Lord Lieutenant and other dignitaries at the celebrations, including a Beacon Lighting. International affairs continued with the signing of a twinning agreement with Shoham in Israel and the visit of their mayor. Also I visited Offenburg to celebrate 40 years of Town Twinning. Here in Borehamwood I was warmly welcomed by the Romanian community at their festivities and in the town we celebrated the success of our local football team and the centenary of the local bus service. I attended events at churches, synagogues and Bhaktivedanta Manor. My Mayoral Charity, the Borehamwood Foodbank, benefitted from a number of concerts, including the Elstree Mozart Players, Borehamwood Brass and BBC Concert Band. We had a wonderful programme of entertainment throughout the year culminating in the Twin Town visits and celebrations for the King's Coronation".

Community services

Hall bookings: Fairway Hall was open for the entire Municipal Year with a total usage of 1,686 hours (income = \pm 30,328.76).

The Site Warden team was joined by an additional full time staff member in the summer which enabled us to increase our grass cutting schedule into the autumn months and carry out further hedge and tree works over the winter at all the allotment sites.

Planning and Consultations: The Council continued to consider planning applications referred to it by Hertsmere Borough Council as a statutory consultee. 343 were considered in total. Comments were made on 49 of these with concerns including issues of smaller unit developments failing to meet local needs for family sized homes and concerns over the high levels of retrospective applications locally. Objections were made to developments on the Green Belt.

Site and street maintenance: The Council maintains the film plaques in Borehamwood, 57 benches and 11 notice boards. Both War

School swimming: The Council continued to support local schools in meeting the cost of travel to The Venue swimming pool for lessons.

Youth Council: The Youth Council continues to grow and contribute to Council decision making with representation on the Sustainable Transport Sub-Committee and Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group. Members have developed a work programme and are now active members of the new community board at the Sky Studios.
