

This year we remember the birth of our Saviour at our Carol Service on 17 December 2023 at 11am. We would love to see you.


What happens in our meetings?



Town defibrillators

Vice-Chairman of Elstree and Borehamwood Residents Association (EBRA) Lawrence Stack and Deputy Leader of Elstree and Borehamwood Town Council, Cllr Dan Ozarow visited Morrisons in Borehamwood to hear about how staff are trained to assist customers to utilise the defibrillator that was installed there in 2016, in the event of heart attacks.

The defibrillator was one of seven that were unveiled throughout the town in 2016 by EBRA, the Town Council and The British Heart Foundation after Lawrence established a project team to instal Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) for which funding was raised by several local councillors, businesses and charities at the time. The

two also conducted an audit of the Morrisons' and remaining AEDs that EBRA had installed to verify that they are all operable.

Almost 50 AEDs are positioned at strategic sites around town, although new potential locations are currently being identified. When Natwest Bank on Shenley Road closed last year regrettably the defibrillator was removed. However Lawrence and Dan are seeking to replace the 24 hour public defibrillator there so that there is an accessible kit close to the high street and The Boulevard.

Walking is the simplest way to get active. It's fun and it improves your physical and mental health. Join one of our sociable walks and discover the joy of being outside in the company of others.

There are nine free walks across Elstree and Borehamwood. To find one near you visit Hertfordshire Health Walks Information and Timetables.

Our walks are for all abilities and fitness levels and are led by friendly volunteers – one at the front and one at the back – to keep everyone together. Our short First Steps Walks in Cowley Hill, Bushey and Potter's Bar are ideal for people who haven't walked in a while, who are returning from illness or who find they can't walk as far as they used to. Many are suitable for pushchair and wheelchair users.

Volunteer Marion, who leads a First Steps Walk in Hatfield, said "Whenever people go on a Health Walk, they tell me they are glad they came along and feel better for it. It is mood lifting, relaxed and free. Not many things are these days!"

People who want more of a work-out might want to pop along to one of our longer walks in Radlet/Aldenham or from the Potter's Bar train station.

There is no need to book. Simply turn up on the day and if it's your first walk we ask that you arrive 10 to 15 minutes before the start of the walk to complete a New Walker Form. If you prefer, you can register online (see link at the bottom of the page).

You can lead walks or provide support from the back. Volunteer once a week or once a month – it's up to you. Borehamwood Foodbank marks 10 years of operation

Borehamwood Foodbank marked its 10th Anniversary with an event held in the Council Chamber at Civic Offices, hosted by Hertsmere Borough Council on Sunday 4 June.

In attendance were volunteers, trustees, staff, supporters, partners and local councillors. Also in attendance were Deputy Lieutenant of Hertfordshire, Dr Ros Taylor, Deputy Mayor of Hertsmere, Cllr Richard Butler, Mayoress Donna Butler, Mayor of Elstree and Borehamwood, Cllr Rebecca Challice and Leader of Hertsmere Borough Council, Cllr Jeremy Newmark.

The organisers were delighted to welcome Kristan Payne, founding Chair of Trustees, wearing her British Empire Medal which was recently

awarded to her in King Charles' inaugural New Year's Honours list for her dedicated work at the Foodbank.

Several speakers gave presentations about the Foodbank's journey over the past 10 years. Amongst them was Father Dominic, another founding Trustee, who has provided the Borehamwood Foodbank with its home at St Teresa's Church in Shenley Road Borehamwood for the past 10 years. He said: "When we first opened our doors 10 years ago, we never realised the full extent of food poverty in our area. The need for our help just keeps rising to levels we never imagined all those years ago. I am just grateful to all those volunteers who have risen to the challenge to help those in food poverty."

Councillor Chris Gray, Hertsmere Borough Council's Portfolio Holder for Communities, Neighbourhoods, Enforcement, Economic Development and Transformation, said: "We were delighted to host the Borehamwood

"The work the foodbank does is instrumental in supporting our residents, with more than 48,000 people supported since the charity began operation in 2013.

"Unfortunately, the Covid-19 pandemic and increased cost of living pressures have resulted in a massive rise in demand on our local foodbanks and we are working with many organisations across Hertsmere to help tackle food poverty in the borough."

Julian Milner, Chair of Trustees of Borehamwood Foodbank,

commented: "Today was no celebration for us. We are witnessing record levels of demand for our services. However, I do celebrate our amazing work and vital support for local people. Our wonderful team of volunteers and staff do a fantastic job in providing a lifeline to vulnerable people in need. We don't want to be here in 10 year's time, marking our 20th anniversary, but all the while there is food poverty in our area, we will be here to offer our support and serve our community."

He added: "Our holistic approach means that we not just providing food parcels. We help find solutions to people's problems, offering many additional on-site services, assisting many with an uplift. This hands on approach is a powerful way to really improve the lives of many. We thank, in particular, the Trussell Trust for its steadfast support over the past 10 years."

Borehamwood Foodbank breaks unwanted records

So far, 2023 has been a busy and challenging year for Borehamwood Foodbank, based at St Teresa's Church 291 Shenley Road.

We are witnessing elevated record demand, helping to feed over 7,200 people in the first nine months of the year. This represents an increase of around 10% versus 2022. Shockingly 42% of these are children. With a cost-of-living crisis only deepening further, and the harsh winter months soon upon us, we are bracing ourselves for tough times ahead.

Founded over 10 years ago and affiliated to the Trussell Trust, our mission is to provide nutritional food parcels to households from all communities in our area that will last three days. We also provide other vital items including toiletries and pet food, as well offering essential products for the winter period such as blankets, flasks and hot water bottles. A central element of our work is to provide practical holistic and financial support to our clients that aims to seek solutions to the reasons why people use our services with the ultimate goal to reduce or eliminate altogether the reasons why food aid is required. We work closely with numerous agencies, including Citizens Advice and the British Red Cross to achieve this. This has produced heart-warming successes, with over £300,000 of financial benefit attained by Citizens Advice Hertsmere for our clients in just over one year.

This summer, as in previous years, we organised six very popular family lunches and activity sessions. These were great fun, with different themes each week, and in total 410 children took part from 188 families

Once again, as in previous years, we supported local families in the late summer with a school uniform scheme so that children could attend the start of the new academic year with new clothing for school. And as we approach the festive season, we will be offering hampers in December, providing some much welcome joy to many.

We are proud that we were able to offer a substantial amount of fuel and energy support to our clients this year. Vouchers and credits have been made available to our clients to help them with gas, electricity and water bills, offering a lifeline to those who have had to made stark choices 'between heating and eating'.

Sadly, on 2 October 2023, we received the tragic news that Fr Dominic McKenna passed away after a short illness. It was Fr Dominic's vision to create our foodbank at St Teresa's Church and as a founding Trustee he laid the foundations of Borehamwood Foodbank. A man full of compassion and unwavering commitment to our whole community, he truly left an indelible mark. His passion for serving those in need will be sorely missed but his work and legacy will continue.

We remain indebted to all our volunteers and staff for their warmth, enthusiasm and hard work this year, without whom none of our activities could take place. I would like to express my thanks to everyone for their dedication to helping those in need. Above all, our Foodbank thanks all our generous supporters without whom we also could not operate.

The evergreen Angel Tree will provide a place of comfort, solace and reflection for local families who have suffered loss to visit, in a serene and accessible setting,

and will allow child siblings to also have somewhere suitable to grieve

and to remember their brothers and sisters when graveyards can be difficult places for them to visit.

Town Council Leader and Hertsmere Borough Council Deputy Mayor Richard Butler, Deputy Town Council Leader Dan Ozarow and Hertsmere portfolio holder for parks Parveen Rani gave moving speeches at the inauguration ceremony which included the release of three doves by Kelly Maskell and Townsend from Up and Flying Dove Releases and a rendition of Amazing Grace sung by Abbie Murray.

All of those present tied blue, pink and white ribbons on the tree in remembrance.

Meanwhile in the evening, Town Mayor Rebecca Challice and Borough Mayor Chris Myers led a Wave of Light candle-lit vigil on the corner of Shenley Road and Furzehill Road for national Baby Loss Awareness Week which ran from 8-15 October.

None of this would have been possible had it not been for the hard work of Tina Nandha - Borehamwood Baby Loss Awareness coordinator, her gifting business Wrap It By Tina which raises funds for baby charity Tommy's and Cllr Dan Ozarow who together had been working to plant the Angel Tree for some time. The Rotary Club of the Studios of Elstree and Borehamwood

The Rotary Club of the Studios of Elstree and Borehamwood, a dedicated and community-focused organisation, have recently been involved with several local community projects within the town, highlighting many aspects of Rotary values of service, raising awareness of different issues that affect everyone.

Saturday 23 September saw the club litter picking around the streets of the Farriers Way Estate in Borehamwood. Club members along with 'Friends of the Club' collected litter that had accumulated around this estate since our last session earlier this year.

On Saturday 7 October 2023 our Club President, Andrew Grady, organised an Autumn Charity Concert, given by Elstree Mozart Players in aid of his designated charity The Alzheimer's Society, raising over $\pounds 600$ for the organisation.

Sunday 15 of October, saw members of the club assist in running the Annual Disability Games held at The Aspire Centre in Stanmore.

The event, organised by the Rotary Club of Barnet, was a collaboration of several Rotary Clubs across Northwest London, which saw disabled people from across the area enjoy an afternoon of sports, which included darts, bagatelle, table tennis, bowls, boccia, to name a few.

The Studios Club team, which included our new international scholar Naomi Kawamoto, who is studying a one year 'master's degree' at the London School of Economics, helped organise the sound system for the event and ran the raffle plus provided some refreshments for the afternoon's event. The raffle raised over £100 for Rotary Charities.

Club president, Andrew Grady provided a 'Trumpet Fanfare' at the prize giving ceremony at the end of the afternoon, with the gold, silver and bronze medals presented by one of the District Governor team.

On Saturday 28 of October the club organised a planting session to raisie awareness and support the End Polio Now campaign. This campaign, led by Rotary International, has made significant strides in

nearly eradicating polio worldwide. The event saw the participation of eight dedicated Rotarians and an additional eight friends and volunteers.

During this planting session, over 3,000 crocus corms were planted in a designated areas at the Elstree & Borehamwood train station and at Allum Manor & Hall. £175 was spent on buying the corms.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation contribute £3 for every £1 spent thus £700 will be spent on the Polio vaccine.

During the planting session, the club seized the opportunity to promote two essential community projects: the Book Swap scheme which promotes literacy and fosters a sense of community by creating an opportunity for individuals to connect through literature. The scheme not only enhances access to reading materials but also encourages social interaction and the exchange of ideas among residents.

The event also promoted Rotary 'Message in a Bottle', a programme which enables users to store essential medical information about medications in a designated bottle placed in their fridge. A corresponding sticker is affixed to their front door, alerting paramedics and first responders to the presence of vital medical information. This initiative ensures that residents receive proper medical attention in emergencies and enhances their overall safety and well-being.

In addition, a special tribute was made by the club planting some croci in a memorial area at St. Teresa's Church in honour of Fr. Dominic, the local Catholic priest for Elstree and Borehamwood, who sadly passed away at the beginning of October.

The significance of the club's activities did not go unnoticed, with Rotary District Governor Suraiya Kassamally joining the group during the crocus planting session.


If you'd like some live music to help your function, go with a swing, the band is available to play at events in and around Borehamwood. We play at fetes, fundraisers, and private parties.

Our new Exhibition is called Your Museum At 10 because we have been at 96 Shenley Road for the 10 years of its existence.



The 'secret' museum on your doorstep

In 1939, Geoffrey de Havilland was looking for a secret location to develop the Mosquito fighter bomber, away from the Hatfield factory. He chose the grounds of Salisbury Hall, between London Colney and South Mimms.

After de Havilland left the site in 1947, the Hall fell into disrepair. In 1955, it was acquired by Audrey and Walter Goldsmith. During its renovation, Walter discovered evidence of the wartime activities. Allegedly, these included a pencil sketch of a Mosquito on a toilet wall. He approached the company for some memorabilia to display. The prototype Mosquito came to light. Bill Baird, a deputy PR manager at de Havilland's factory at Hatfield, had defied an order to destroy it.

From this unorthodox start, Britian's first aviation museum was opened in 1959. Since then, it has evolved from a miscellaneous collection of aviation exhibits into a comprehensive display of over 20 civil, combat and specialist de Havilland aircraft.

The Walter Goldsmith Hangar houses the museum's three Mosquito aircraft, including the 1940 prototype. Known as 'the Wooden Wonder', the Mosquito demonstrated the resourcefulness of Britain in wartime. Unlike aluminium, wood was a non-strategic material and components could be manufactured in furniture factories. Contemporary photographs show that many workers were women. Its design included several creative features. The two halves of the fuselage were shaped over moulds, rather like the two halves of an Easter egg. The entire wing was secured from beneath using just four bolts; the undercarriage assembly consisted of two tubes of interlocking rubber blocks.

This hangar also houses much of the fuselage of a Horsa glider, often called 'the other Wooden Wonder'. The two prototypes were built at

Salisbury Hall. It was famous for carrying 28 troops to a precise location, sometimes in complete darkness and was used on D Day to capture vital bridges close to the landing beaches.

The Geoffrey de Havilland Hangar was completed in 2019 and displays both inter-war and post-war aircraft. These include the famous Tiger Moth, widely used as a pre-war trainer and the Chipmunk, its post-war equivalent. Jet powered aircraft include the Vampire, Sea Venom and the world's first jet airliner, the Comet. This revolutionised international travel, setting new standards of speed and comfort.

Other aircraft are located on the Aviation Field and include a Trident, Heron, Dove, HS 125 and a BAe 146. The 146 was the last airliner assembled at de Havilland's Hatfield factory. Almost 400 were built; versatile, reliable and quiet, they were used for the Queen's Flight for almost 40 years.

Work is about to begin on a dedicated Cold War exhibition in the Amy Johnson Hangar.

As well as the aircraft, there are videos, hands-on displays, short talks and seasonally themed activities for children during the school holidays. The Comet Café offers an expanded range of drinks and snacks; the Aeroshop has an impressive range of kits, books and mementoes.

From modest beginnings, the museum is now a comprehensive display of the de Havilland Company's legacy. Its operation and exhibits are entirely dependent on the skills and commitment of its 200 volunteers. Appropriately, they have recently received The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, equivalent to an MBE.

Mitzvah Day



Borehamwood & Elstree communities offer friendship to vulnerable children as Mitzvah Day Moments 2023 unites to repair the world

On Sunday 30 July 2023 community volunteers, charity workers, local councillors, faith groups and local schoolchildren gathered at the DoubleTree by Hilton Elstree Hotel in Borehamwood to collect and pack donated goods which will be sent directly to vulnerable families and children living locally and across the UK.

The event is part of a series of activities that took place this week for "Mitzvah Moments" coordinated by Mitzvah Day, the UK's largest faithled social action organisation. Underpinned by the Jewish value to heal the world (tikkun olam), the activities were supported by local charities; Comfort Cases UK, Town Mayor's charity Sebby's Corner, Langdon Brady and Hertsmere Mencap.

In the days leading up to event, members of learning disability charities - Langdon Brady and Hertsmere Mencap used their regular arts and crafts sessions to write friendship messages, create birthday cards, paint bookmarks and design welcome gifts for disadvantaged children, those entering the foster care system and refugee children. The project perfectly fit two of Mitzvah Day's 2023 themes; "Repairing the world" and "combatting loneliness."

Pre-loved teen fiction books and new items including nappies, baby milk formula, Calpol, washing powder, fabric conditioner, anti bac cleaning spray, teen pyjamas, roll-on deodorants, sanitary wear, pencils, notebooks, child toothbrushes and travel-sized toiletries were among

the items donated by members of the public. Sky Studios Elstree, WD6 Food Support also helped with donated items and DoubleTree by Hilton Elstree Hotel kindly provided the venue.

The initiative was inspired by one of the coordinating organisations; Comfort Cases UK- whose mission is to bring a sense of hope and dignity to children moving into the foster care system by ending the practice of them being handed a bin bag to take their belongings in when doing so. Instead they provide them with a backpack filled with items centred around their needs and in doing so, showing these children they are loved and respected. "A comfort case."

This follows a series of Borehamwood and Elstree Mitzvah Day events in recent years in which cards and snack bags were prepared for seriously ill children and the elderly, more than 3,000 bulbs were planted and local schoolchildren launched the Children's Climate Emergency Manifesto, conducted a litter pick and their pictures were put on display in a "Homage to Planet Earth" at Gratitude's Hub on Elstree Way . Rather than on a single day, Mitzvah Day Moments take place through out the year and give charities the opportunity to work with new partners, to spread kindness and help repair the world.

Borehamwood & Elstree Mitzvah Moment Coordinator, Cllr Dan Ozarow said: In recent years thousands of children and adults in Borehamwood and Elstree have taken part in successful Mitzvah Day events that have really captured the imagination. Two of the aims of Mitzvah Day Moments are to show that actually, we can try to repair the world every







day of the year and also to develop new networks and collaborations. So I am especially delighted that Langdon Brady and Hertsmere Mencap's members have extended the hand of friendship to children they have never met through the cards and bookmarks they have created for the children that Comfort Cases UK and Sebby's Corner support.

Sarah Laster, CEO of Comfort Cases UK said: As a Mitzvah Day Beneficiary Award Winner we know the importance and strength in collaboration between small charities who work in the same space. We are shown the power of kindness and good deeds (mitzvahs) by the local community and supporters on a daily basis. Children who benefit from our projects are from all cultures and socio-economic backgrounds. Times are hard for us all at the moment, but never more so than for the children we support. Small charities are filling the gaps of underfunded statutory services. Every small donation will make a big difference. Together we can do so much more.

Rebecca Challice, Town Mayor of Elstree & Borehamwood said: It was an honour to be supporting this special event. I would like to thank all the organisers and volunteers involved in coordinating the day. I understand how invaluable their efforts are and the impact that these Mitzvah Moment activities will have on local families.

Andy, who was in foster care as a child explains how he and others benefit from projects like this: I can't remember much from my childhood but one of my earliest memories was coming home and finding all my stuff shoved into giant, clear plastic sacks. My favourite cuddly toy (Honey the Bear), all smooshed up against the side of one of these sacks. That was over 30 years ago, and that image stays with me. It still holds a lot of power over me.

Mitzvah Day is the UK's largest faith-led day of social action. A Jewish-led celebration, over 55,000 people around the world come together to give time, not money, to make a difference to the community around us. mitzvahday.org.uk/

Shoham town twinning deepens as football team visits Borehamwood

Emotional visit culminates in match between Boreham Wood FC XI and Maccabi Shoham FC at Meadow Park Stadium

At the end of July 2023 a promising young football team of 16-19 year olds from Shoham in central Israel visited Elstree & Borehamwood, as the next stage of the historic town twinning agreement that was signed between our two towns earlier this year.

The visit culminated in a hard-fought friendly match between Maccabi Shoham FC and a Boreham Wood FC XI which was held at the Mangata Pay UK Stadium, Meadow Park on Sunday 23 July 2023. Ending in a 1-0 victory for the Israeli visitors, a 500-strong local crowd consisted mainly of school children and families who were treated to an exciting game.

During the week, the Shoham team trained with the Boreham Wood FC local Academy and were also joined by "Wood Army" manager, Luke Garrard

In addition, they visited Kenilworth Primary School in Borehamwood, answering questions from enthralled pupils in a school assembly and treating them to football training sessions. Managed by David Smila and coached by former Israeli international striker, Ofer Shitrit, the team were guests of honour at a community breakfast at which community groups, faith leaders, local councillors and residents participated and they also visited Arsenal FC's Emirates Stadium and other attractions in central London.

The occasion breathed life into the recent twin town agreement between Elstree & Borehamwood Town Council and Shoham, a town of 26,000 residents, and is the first such twinning for decades between

the UK and Israel. It followed an official signing ceremony that took place in March 2023 during a visit by the Mayor of Shoham and other dignitaries. As part of an exchange that will mutually benefit residents in the two countries, plans are afoot for collaborations on robotics, creative arts and sport as well as a return visit next year.

Manager of Boreham Wood FC, Luke Garrard said: "It was an absolute pleasure to have been involved in this historic week, the bond the Club has made with everyone from Maccabi Shoham was incredible. The connection between myself and the Staff and Players of Shoham will be long lasting. I really look forward to seeing how the future looks between the two Towns, if the start is anything to go by, I can see this being a flourishing relationship for years to come."

Cllr Rebecca Challice, Mayor of Elstree & Borehamwood Town Council said: "We have witnessed not only an exhilarating football match but also a celebration of friendship, and unity. We can proudly say that this twinning agreement is living up to its aim of forging cultural, educational, leisure, and business links between our two communities. The youth team from Shoham spending a week training with Boreham Wood FC has been a pivotal part of this exchange, fostering bonds of friendship and understanding that will endure."

David Smila, Manager of Maccabi Shoham FC said: "It was a dream week for us and the players that we will never forget. The twinning relationship came from the heart and we wanted to thank the people of Elstree and Borehamwood, the Town Council for hosting us, Danny and Billy Hunter at Boreham Wood FC and Luke Garrard the Manager for helping us train with the team. We are sure that this will be the first in a tradition that will become regular in terms of exchange visits between Shoham and Borehamwood. The alliance of twin towns will

Cllr Dan Ozarow, Chair of Elstree & Borehamwood Town Council's International Affairs Sub-Committee said: "Maccabi Shoham FC's visit this week has lit up our town and created a real buzz. Local people have welcomed them with warmth. The football training they gave the school children, the free tickets for the match that Boreham Wood FC kindly offered to the whole community and the cultural exchanges between the two sets of players during shared training sessions between the academy sides from both towns are examples of practical benefits that this visit has had for people in Elstree and Borehamwood this week alone."

Cllr Jeremy Newmark, Leader of Hertsmere Borough Council and one of the instigators of the twinning arrangement commented: "We've been immensely privileged to host FC Maccabi Shoham over the past week. Borehamwood and Shoham are towns with shared values whose football clubs sit at the heart of their communities. We thank Danny and Billy Hunter, Luke Garrard and all at Boreham Wood FC for their huge contribution to this tremendous initiative that has added a new dimension to this town twinning and helped position our Borough as a

new hub of municipal internationalism."

Cllr Sandra Parnell, Elstree & Borehamwood Town Councillor and one of the instigators of the twinning arrangement commented: "It was my privilege in March of 2023 to have signed a memorandum with the Mayor of Shoham to our twinning of Shoham in Israel and Borehamwood here in the UK.

Then came our beautiful week of football with our great BWFC courtesy of Danny Hunter the chairman of the football club, and with the help of the Town Council.

The meeting of the twin towns was an excellent opportunity for our schools, our great teachers and for our residents to get to know another town , as well as Offenburg in Germany and Fontanay-aux-Roses in France.

I am extremely excited for all three towns to be involved in getting to know each other.

It was a pleasure working with, Danny, Billy and Luke at BWFC. Cllr Jeremy Newmark, the town officers Dan Tracey, Jenny and many more all worked so hard and of course all of the residents in Borehamwood to help to make this a memorable occasion."

First, Deputy Mayor Alpha Collins gave a brief speech. Then, following the hymn, the church father blessed the wreaths


Subsequently, we all went to the Elstree War Memorial, where we paid a two-minute silence to those who served in the armed forces and
